High performance results in community support.

On Tuesday the 2nd of June, Peter Coen together with management from Comdain Infrastructure (“Comdain”) and Multinet Gas (“MG”) as well as staff involved in the Comdain and MG contract, joined together to present a donation to the not for profit community based organization Waverley Emergency Adolescent Care (WEAC). Maureen Buck, CEO of WEAC, accepted the donation on behalf of the organisation.

The donation was made possible through the exceptional performance of the Comdain and MG teams working together (challenging/optimizing/innovating) to achieve budget under-runs. It was decided that befitting the exceptional team performance, would be to give back to the community via a charitable organisation, that has particular significance to the geographical location in which our team operate – Eastern and Southern Melbourne.

Comdain was first introduced to WEAC and the incredible work they do during a Multinet and United Energy stakeholder evening in 2013. Taken back by the harsh reality of the adverse conditions that a large number of adolescents are living with on a day to day basis (including drug, physical and sexual abuse), as well as the extensive support that WEAC provide these teenagers and their families. It was decided that Comdain needed to find a way to support such a worthy charitable organisation.



WEAC is a community based, non-profit agency in the Eastern and Southern Suburbs of Melbourne, whose primary role is to help teenagers in adversity and prevent total family breakdowns by providing an opportunity for time-out accommodation, together with preventative or additional services such as meditation, family therapy and specialist counseling.

WEAC has a network of local support families who are trained and experienced volunteers who care about young people and believe in family life. WEAC is for families and teenagers where a teenager may require emergency, medium or long term accommodation due to adverse situations.

Well done to the entire Comdain and MG team, you should be proud of the achievements and contributions that have been made to this project which ensured that this donation was possible. The funds will go some way to assisting WEAC in their ongoing battle to support adolescences experiencing these adverse living conditions.
